Grade Level / Course Summary with Big Ideas:

This PA Standards aligned course is designed to raise student awareness of 21st Century issues that characterize our world today while analyzing the challenges facing us in a globalized society. By examining a variety of case studies throughout the world, students will explore issues including, but not limited to, world poverty, global health in developing countries, current conflicts and cooperation among nations, women's rights, and the roles of the European Union and the United Nations in maintaining world peace and security. Upon exposure to these various issues, students will study in a collaborative setting, analyze and evaluate current solutions to these global issues, and create their own possible resolutions that could be applied to solve the various economic, social, and political issues facing the world we live in today.
